YouGov interviewed 302 respondents in North Dakota who were then matched down to a sample of 300 each to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, and race. The frame was constructed by stratified sampling from YouGov's own sampling frame for likely voters based on the full validated state voter lists. The likely voter model for both states was based on voter registration status and past voting history. The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, and education. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles.
